

⁴⁴While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. ⁴⁵The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, ⁴⁶for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, ⁴⁷"Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" ⁴⁸So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. THE SERMON

All are Seated.

BAPTISMAL PRESENTATION

All Stand and turn toward the Font as the Clergy, Candidates, and Family move toward it.

Presider: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The Candidates are presented individually by their Sponsors or Godparents, as follows:

Sponsors / Godparents: We present Abbie Esther Braun to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Presider asks the Candidate / Sponsor: Do you desire to be baptized? Candidate / Sponsor: I do.

The Presider asks the parents and godparents the candidates presented:

Presider: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents & Godparents: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents & Godparents: I will, with God's help.

Then the Presider asks the following of the Candidates

Presider: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Parents & Godparents: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you reject the evil powers of the world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Parents & Godparents: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Parents & Godparents: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Parents & Godparents: I do.

Presider: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Parents & Godparents: I do.

Presider: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Parents & Godparents: I do.

Then the Presider addresses the Congregation:

Presider: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

People: We will!

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

All Remain Standing. (8:00AM will renew the Baptismal Covenant as follows.)

Presider: Let us join with her who is committing herself to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, He was conceived by the power of the Holy

Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the

living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the

forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

All Remain Standing.

Presider: Let us now pray for Abbie Esther Braun who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

The Priest continues with the following Prayers and the People join in with the **bold** text:

Reader: Deliver her, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: Open her hearts to your grace and truth.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: Fill her with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: Keep her in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: Teach her to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: Send her into the world in witness to your love.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: Bring her to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Presider: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever.

People: Amen.

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

The following Blessing is said:

Presider: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The following Prayers are said by the Presider:

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

People: Amen.

THE BAPTISM

All Remain Standing.

The candidate is presented by name to the Presider, who then immerses or pours water upon the candidate, saying: Presider: Abbie, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Parents & Godparents: Amen.

Presider: Abbie, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

Parents & Godparents: Amen.

Presider: Abbie, receive the light of Christ; and may you walk in this light all the days of your life.

Parents & Godparents: Amen.

The baptismal candle is lit and given to a god parent.

Presider: Let us pray. Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

People: Amen.





WORDS OF INSTITUTION

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation. Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new. And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all. When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.






